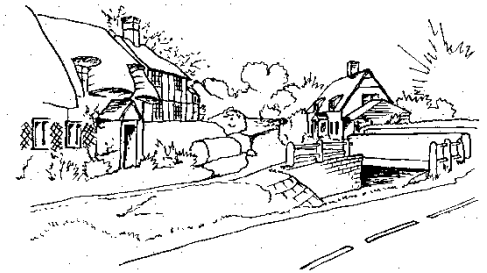

Arkesden Parish Council Meeting

Chair Brief

1. Apologies for Absence / Election of Meeting Chair

Present: Alistair Mclean, Jonathan Boon, Sophie Garrod, Mark Newey, Holly Greenhow, Wendy Dyce, Beth Savory (Clerk) and Cllr Edward Oliver

3. District councillor's report

Edward informed Councillors that he has invited the Chair of ECC to attend the APC meeting. They will be looking after our area if elected in the next election.

4. County councillor's report

Cllr Paul Gadd provided an update via email in advance of the meeting which was read out by the Chair.

With regards to flooding and drainage confirmed that the drain and ditch on Quicksie Hill have now been cleared and continues to chase on the repair of the pothole at the same location.

In relation to Highways and transport Cllr Gadd confirmed that information had been forwarded to Councillors on the weight limits on the three bridges in Arkesden. Cllr Gadd detailed that enforcement of weight limits is generally problematic, but to let him know of any significant breaches. Cllr Gadd also updated that are no further member pothole schemes this year but to continue to flag any serious problems that require chasing.

5. Declaration of interests

Minutes from the January & February meetings were approved and signed.

7. Matters arising from 16 February 2026 meeting

- Litter pick

It was confirmed that the annual litter pick is scheduled for Saturday 28th March at 10.30am.

- Main Street bridge

The Clerk confirmed that ECC's Flood team were in agreement with APC to keep with a bridge rather than a Culvert. The plan is to remove the existing bridge and install a new bridge. The new bridge will be a wooden style PROW bridge with post and rail hand rails (like the existing).

Alistair raised that the retaining wall close to the bridge is massively eroded and requires repair.

Action: Alistair to send photos over to Clerk for reporting to ECC.

8. Ongoing Matters – Cllr Areas of Focus Updates

- Website (JB)

The Clerk updated that there was a temporary issue with the events calendar caused by an update by WordPress that didn't match our website 'template'. It's now been resolved but there are some further updates pending for other features which have potential to cause further issues.

Action: Councillors to report anything that doesn't look right to the Clerk or Jonathan.

- Potholes (MN)

Mark updated that the drain issue at the Quicksie Hill pothole has been resolved but the pothole issue remains outstanding. He confirmed that it's a separate team but is still being chased by Cllr Paul Gadd.

- Speed Limits (SG)

Sophie circulated a draft response to the traffic survey to Councillors via email for comment.

Action: Councillors to review draft response and provide feedback.

- Vehicle activated speed sign

The Clerk confirmed that APC have opted into the scheme with Uttlesford and the next step relates to legislation around the licence/permit required for the installation of the VAS posts.

- Neighbourhood Watch

Jonathan highlighted the current increased risk of housing oil theft due to the rise in prices.

Action: Jonathan to send out note on neighbourhood watch group.
